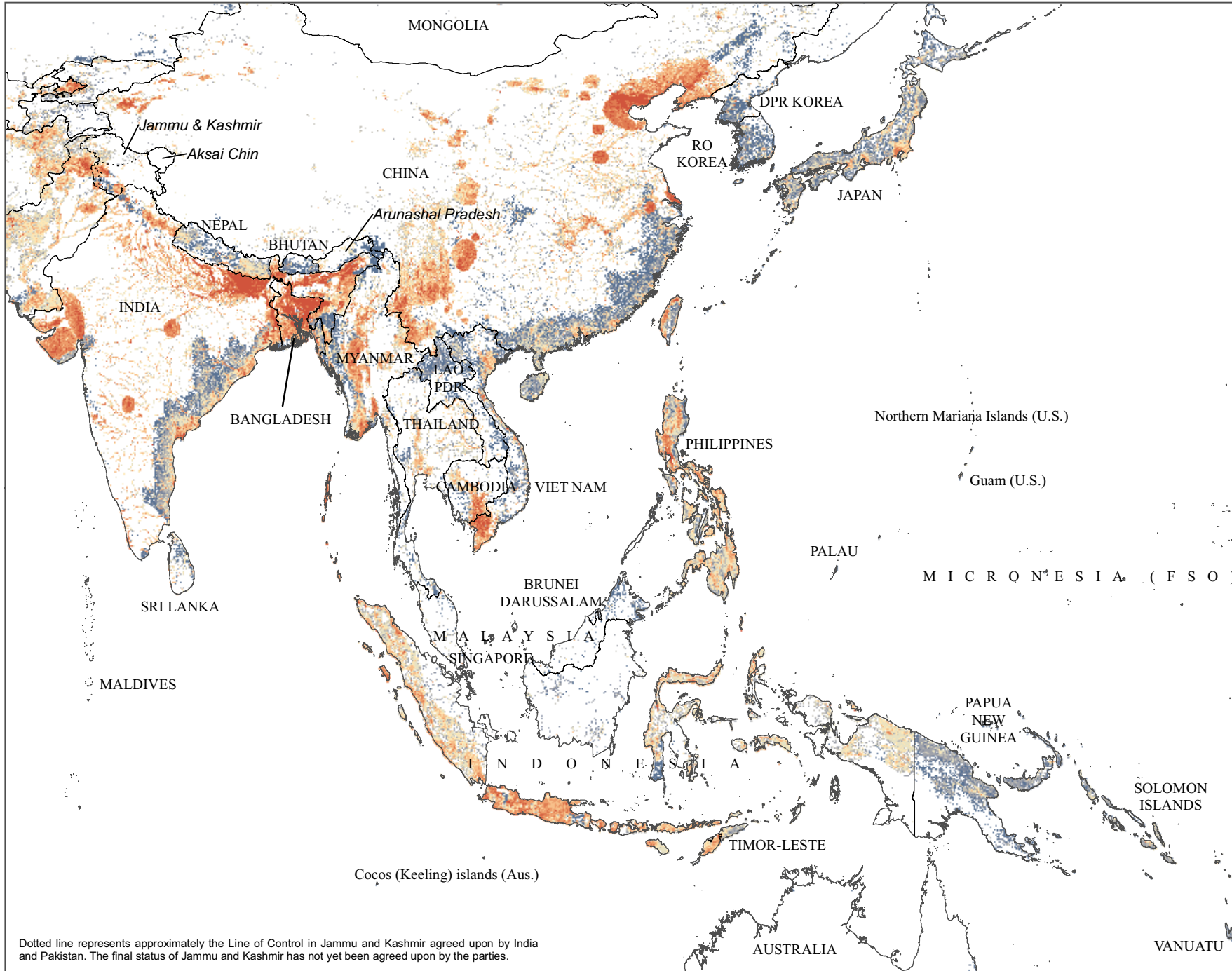


Estimated Risk Index for Multiple Hazards

Asia-Pacific Region as of May 2009

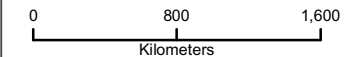


This map shows the estimate of the global risk induced by multiple hazards (tropical cyclone, earthquake, flood and landslide induced by precipitations)
